Fields & Futures receives \$30,000 grant from Oklahoma City Community Foundation

The grant will be used to help design and build a walking trail at Webster Middle School, to be enjoyed by the Webster community for many years to come.

Fields & Futures, in partnership with Oklahoma City Public Schools Athletics and other partner organizations, rebuilt all athletic fields at Webster Middle School in 2013 as part of their mission to IGNITE SUCCESS – one field, one coach, one student at a time. This walking trail will add an important element to the overall transformation of the Webster Middle School sports complex.
